- (iv) Elaine will contact **John Decker**, archivist at the Stearns County History Museum for a presentation focusing on other ethnic groups in the Stearns county area.
- (v) Elaine also suggested Blaine Hedberg for a presentation about the Norwegian settlements in the West Central Minnesota area including information on some of the travels of Rev. Realf Ottesen Brandt and the congregations he visited in Douglas and Stearns counties in the 1867 timeframe.
- (vi) **Veryln Anderson** will be contacted for Keynote speech.
- (vii) An "Antique Appraisal Roadshow" following Saturday morning brunch. This has been successfully done by other groups. Participants would be asked to preregister—there is a limited amount of time available and by preregistering it would give the appraiser an opportunity to research the item if necessary.
