Fra Presidenten

I'm very happy to confirm that the 2021 Tre Lag Stevne will be held in person in August at the Madison Marriot West in Middleton, WI. We will be following health guidelines in place at that time. Dane County recently reduced some restrictions on large gatherings and

social distancing. With vaccination rates rising, authorities predict more easing of health and safety guidelines through the summer. It will be so good to see old friends, meet new people, and reconnect with each other.

The stevne steering committee has lined up a great program again this year. Speakers from the University of Wisconsin Madison and from the Wisconsin State Historical Society fill half of the program. Lawrence Moe, Glenn Borreson and Lars Walker are returning with new presentations. Check out the stevne agenda in this issue to see the full list of topics. The tour will take us to Stoughton and Cambridge, both in one of the most important Norwegian immigrant areas – the Koshkonong Settlement.

Some good news for those planning to attend the stevne; the Marriott management informed us at the end of May that due to changes in business travel and hotel bookings they have lowered the nightly room charge to \$102 per night from the original contract rate of \$133. Room tax charges will still apply, but this is a really big break for us.

Something New Coming in 2022

This year's stevne will be the last Tre Lag Stevne. The three lags (NHOH, Gudbrandsdalslaget, Trønderlag) have met together since 2003, sharing the planning and coordination to put on a continuous string of successful meetings. All who have attended any of the annual events have come away with greater understanding of our shared Norwegian roots, genealogic knowledge, and many new and long-term friends. Beginning in 2022, there will be five lags joining forces to put on the annual meetings. The merger with Romerikslaget and Solørlag, will bring new ideas and new

friends to our stevne experience. The new steering committee selected the name Flere Lag Stevne. See the article in this issue for more details.

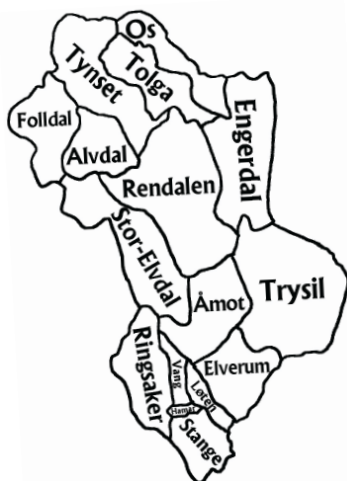

Our NHOH Purpose

The Lag is organized exclusively for educational purposes. To the extent consistent with this general purpose, the specific purposes of the Lag are to help people learn more about the history, culture, and customs of the Nord Hedmark and Hedemarken area of Norway and to aid in the preservation of that heritage; to teach and assist people in genealogy research; to gather immigration and settlement history and develop immigration data; to develop a library of resources, such as bygdebøker (farm histories) and Norwegian church, census, and probate records; and to encourage the research and writing of family, immigration, and settlement histories.

NHOH Lag members benefit from expert genealogy research assistance, are invited to participate in our annual 3-day conference and receive our newsletter three times a year.

Announcing the Flere Lag Stevne

On March 4, 2021, the presidents of five lags (Gudbrandsdalslag, NHOH Lag, Romerikslag, Soløslag I America, and Trønderlag) met via Zoom and approved combining efforts for hosting joint stevner.

In April, representatives from the lags met via Zoom to formally set up the new steering committee. One of the first items of business was to select a name. More than 30 names were proposed by people from each of the lags over several months. The final voting presented us with the name **Flere Lag Stevne**. Flere translates to '**several**', which allows us to easily expand if other lags wish to join us because the name is not limited to a number of lags or to a particular area of Norway.

Officers were elected from the two voting members representing each lag. Chairperson: Robert Fossum (Tro), Vice Chair: Norma Barnes (Rom), Secretary: Nancy Pickering (Gud), Treasurer: Joy Shong (NHed). Other representatives on the steering committee are: Dick Lundgren (Gud), Dixie Hansen (NHed), Mike Miller (Rom), LeAnn Hookom (Sol), Kathy Johnson (Sol), Sam Christenson (Tro).

Farms of our Ancestors

Løkstad Farm - by Shirley Lokstad Schoenfeld



This is the Løkstad farm by **Bardu in Trøms, Norway** where my maiden name comes from. Grandfather and Grandmother's aunt and uncle lived there. Grandma Elen Løkstad's ancestors, Ole Oleson Brandvold and his son-in-law John Simonsen Kalbækken (and their wives) came from Tynset and Alvdal in 1791. They were the first Norwegian settlers in Bardu, amongst the Sami folk. I have been to this farm, and Elen's ancestors farm below – from 1791.

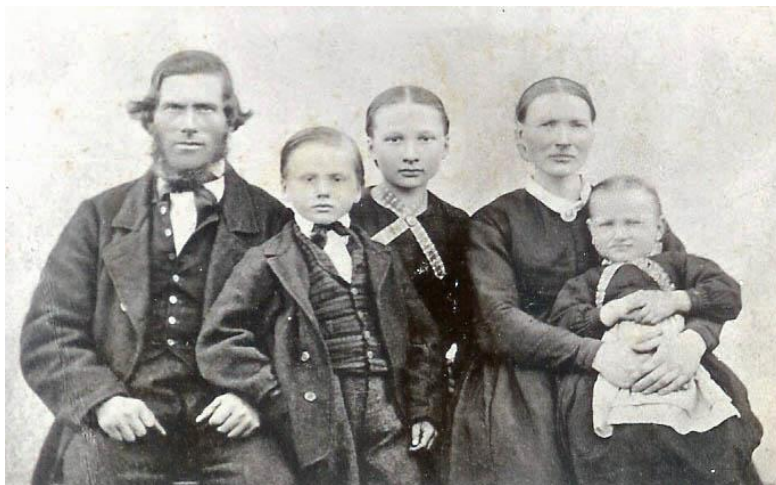
This was Ole Oleson Brandvold and John Simonsen Kalbækken's first place – at Bardujord

In Memorium

Arthur Franklin Hawkinson

July 19, 1937 - May 8, 2021



Arthur Franklin Hawkinson, age 83, of Hudson, Wisconsin passed away May 8, 2021 at Region's Hospital in St. Paul, Minnesota after complications from a previous stroke.

He was born July 19, 1937 to Clifford and Edna (Hollenbeck) Hawkinson in

St. Croix Falls, Wisconsin. Art was raised in Jordon, Montana. After graduating from Garfield County High School, he joined the United States Navy. After his four years of enlistment, Art married Nancy Lorraine Gartmann, October 15, 1960, a union blessed with 58 years and four children. He worked for Dictaphone and 3M before opening Art's Auto Parts in downtown Hudson 1969, a town staple until his retirement in 1993. Art was also very proud of the home he built in St. Joseph where he and Nancy raised their family. The two were very active genealogists and grew Christmas trees for many years.

Art will be remembered by his four children; Ken (Debbie) Hawkinson, Jay Hawkinson, Karine (Matt) Maynard, and Robyn (Jeff) Wefel, nine grandchildren; Julia (Patrick) Callaghan, Jakob Wilson, Ford (Kaitlyn) Hawkinson, Elaine (Zack) De Moulin, Ben Hawkinson, Nick Hawkinson, Sarah Hawkinson, Anthony Wefel, and Carter Wefel, his sisters; Caroline Ashcraft and Frances (Henry) Greaux, brother-in-law Bob (Faye) Gartmann; sister-in-law Chris Gartmann, as well as many other nieces, nephews and extended family members.

Art is proceeded in death by his wife Nancy, sister Dorothy (Harlan) Krinke, brother Chet Spracklin, and his parents.

Pastor James Olson

April 29, 1939 - March 13, 2021



Pastor James Olson, 81, of Grand Island, NE and formerly of Sioux Falls passed away Saturday March 13, 2021 at a care center in Grand Island.

Private funeral services were held Saturday March 20, 2021 at St. John's Lutheran Church in Webster. Burial will be at Fron Lutheran Cemetery near

Roslyn.

Jim was born April 29, 1939 in Webster, SD to Norman and Bernice (Peterson) Olson. Jim attended elementary country school and graduated from Roslyn High School.

Jim began his vocational career as a sixth-grade teacher at Hawthorne Elementary School in Sioux Falls, SD. Jim received recognition for beginning a library in his classroom for his students, thus sharing his love of reading. Jim served as Lutheran Campus Minister at Stout State University in Menomonie, Wisconsin, Lutheran Campus Minister at the University of Minnesota in St. Paul, MN and at the University of South Dakota in Vermillion. In 1970-1972, Jim served as Children's Editor, Division for Parish Education of the American Lutheran Church in Minneapolis. Following that assignment, he became Director of Children's Ministries for the American Lutheran Church. Later, Jim served congregations in Minnesota, North and South Dakota, he, also, served as secretary of the South Dakota Synod, ELCA and completed his career serving as the Rostered Ministry Coordinator of the South Dakota Synod, ELCA in 2005. Jim was a member of First Lutheran Church in Sioux Falls, SD.

Jim was active in the Gudbrandsdalslaget, an organization of Norwegian-Americans whose ancestors came from Gudbrandsdalen, Oppland, Norway. He served as president from 2003-2010 and 2015-2018. Jim turned his hobby of collecting antiques and books into a small business of selling them upon his retirement. He never lost his interest in collecting antiques and reading books.

Jim is survived by many siblings, nieces, nephews and cousins.

Memorials are suggested to the endowment fund of the Gudbrandsdalslag.

Stevne Tour

Koshkonong Settlement – Learn more on this year's stevne tour

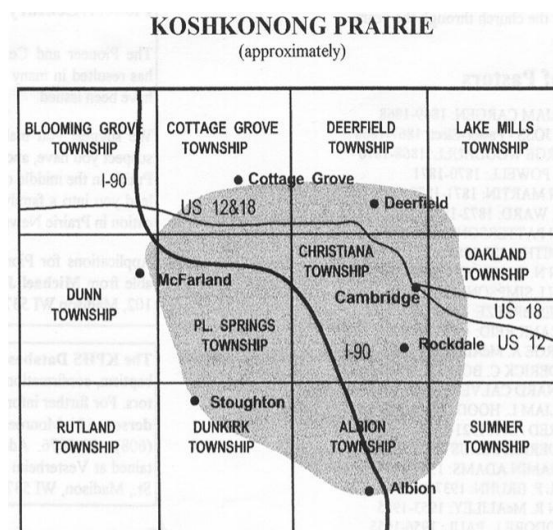
This year's stevne tour will take us to the Koshkonong Historical Society School Museum and to Livsreise Heritage Center. Both provide a wealth of information on the immigrant experience of the Norwegians who settled in the Koshkonong Settlement.

Though the first Norwegians to immigrate as a group came in 1825 on the sloop Restauration, by the 1840's they reached what is now Dane County in southern Wisconsin. Gunnel Olson Vindeig built the first house along the Koshkonong Creek around 1840 and was the first settler in what would be called the Koshkonong Settlement. Many Norwegians from the Illinois communities of Fox River and Jefferson Prairie, Illinois moved to the area seeking better land. By the 1850's over half of the Wisconsin Norwegians lived in the Koshkonong area. Koshkonong became a transition point for many newcomers moving on to places farther west.

Also In 1840, Bjørn Anderson and his family arrived in what is now the township of Albion and began farming. They were the first Norwegian settlers in that location. In 1894 a monument to the early Norwegian settlers was unveiled on the Amund Anderson farm in the township of Christiania. It can still be seen at the farm on Highway A southwest of Cambridge.

The Koshkonong Settlement extended from McFarland and Oregon on the west to Lake Mills in Jefferson County to the east, and from Sun Prairie and Marshall in the north to Edgerton to the south. Communities that were almost entirely Norwegian include Stoughton, Edgerton, Cambridge, Rockdale, Deerfield, and McFarland.

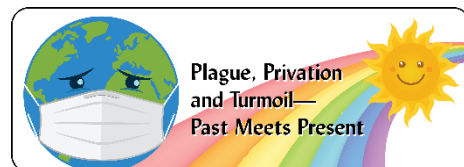
