Recently, global media outlets have taken an interest in the concept, pointing to Norway as an example of how to incorporate nature into your life to reduce stress and promote wellbeing. 

	Seminar A: Kubb ... or is it Viking Chess? —Dee Dee and Jason Halvorson Kubb is a yard game. The word rhymes with ‘tube’. Legend has it that it was created by the Vikings, but there is no written proof or photos. The concept is to toss wood batons (dowels) at wood kubbs (blocks). The team that clears the kubbs then knocks over the center King wins. No scoring. Teams can be one to six players. Big in the Midwest. Huge in Norway, Sweden, Germany. Some call it Viking Chess. I’ll explain and demonstrate how to play and throw the baton. We will discuss some variations of backyard rules and US tournament rules. I’ll also cover some of the strategy and what makes the game so fun for all ages and skill levels.	Royale A
	Seminar B: The Birkebeiner—North America’s Biggest XC Race! —Barry Knapp & Darald Bothun, Coaches for the Rochester Nordic Ski Team Baby Prince Haakon’s rescue in 1206 by warriors on skis and wearing birch leggings (“birkebeiner”) created the legend behind the American Birkebeiner cross country ski race held annually in Northern Wisconsin. Barry Knapp and Darald Bothun, active ski coaches and multi-year “Birkie” racers, will tell you the story of Prince Haakon then take you to cross country skiing today and the 50km American Birkebeiner. The talk will also include a brief description of the various types of xc skiing, the many different events held during Birkie week, and the story of Per Ostigaard, from Hoffman, MN, who skied over 30 Birkies and 10 Korties until age 91! 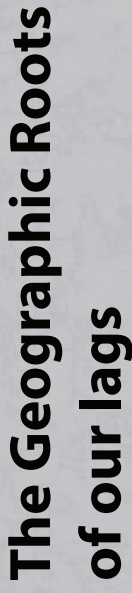
