In a manner befitting the Bicentennial celebration of Norway's constitution, the Tre Lag Stevne planning team has assembled a group of interesting and entertaining events to make the 2014 stevne memorable and worthy of a nod of

approval from our ancestors. We start Wednesday August 6th at 1:00 PM with a tour derived from "*Mother Mary, Moon Shine and the Mississippi*," a tour offered by the St. Cloud Area Convention & Visitors Bureau. We'll have opportunities to sample the architecture and stories of the St. Cloud Cathedral, feast on the collections and exhibits of the Stearns (County) History Museum, and savor a tasty box dinner, but regrettably no tippie of the moonshine. In the evening a seminar, Beginning "Norwegian" Genealogy, is offered, and the genealogy lab will be open.

On Thursday morning our series of seminars gets in high gear with a double feature. First up is the **Keynote** address by Taryn Flolid. She will stitch together the patches of our **Country Quilt** theme as it relates to "Homesteaders: Post Civil War Settlements in Western Minnesota." Then follows **Headliner** Prof. John R. Christianson with a very knowledgeable and insightful presentation on the Norwegian Constitution and how today, 200 years later, it still stirs joy, pride, respect, reverence and admiration in Norwegians and people of many other lands. Thursday evening features a concert by the Tre Lag Musicians with Norwegian music and a chance to hear, learn/, and sing Norway's **Bicentennial Song**, *Det Går et Festtog Gjennom Landet*, (*A Festival Parade is Marching through the Land*) A few other seminars/items of interest through Thursday and Friday include:

Membership Renewal Policy

The membership year used to be the calendar year, and we allowed a very long grace period for renewals, allowing members to renew for the current year up until the stevne before sending out reminders. Then members had until October to renew before being dropped.

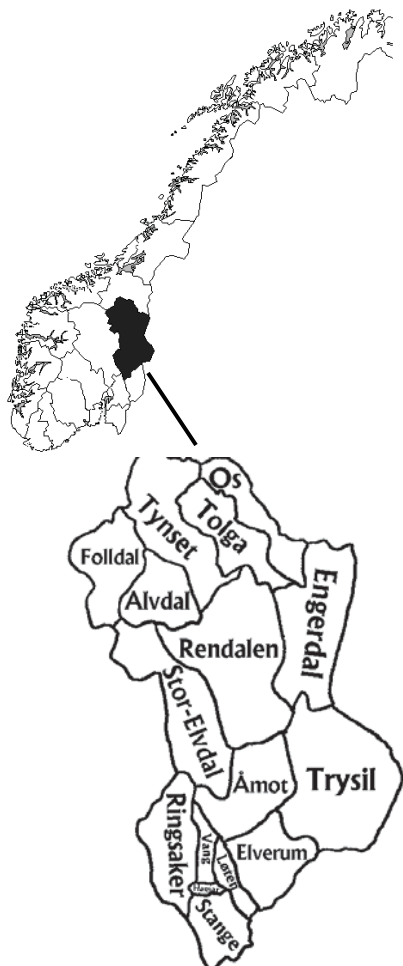

Cora O. Christensen

November 30, 1910 - May 29, 2014

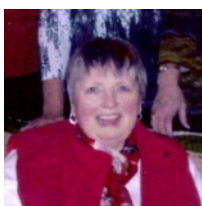

Member Area Access

The member's-only area of the NHOH website requires a user ID and password. For 2014 the user name is "NHOH2014" and the password is "Bruker" These words are case sensitive so you will need to type them exactly as printed here (without quotation marks). They are the same for all members. To reach information in the member's-only area, first click on the "Member Area" button in the left border of most website pages. Then, click on the link for the content that you wish to view. You will then be prompted to enter a user name and password.

STEVNE APPRAISALS EVENT

Do you still have that old object/artifact around the house that you've always wondered what's it called, what's it used for, or where it came from? How about, is it maybe actually worth something! Well, the stevne appraisals event on our closing Saturday morning is the way to get many answers. Professional appraisers Bonnie Lindberg and Jim Marrinan of Appraisal Specialists Midwest (<http://asmw.net/index.html>) will host an "Antiques Road Show" style event, and you can bring your object(s). You can bring almost anything that you can carry. It can be Norwegian or Scandinavian, but that's not a requirement. However some things are restricted for a variety of reasons, among them:

- ♦ Jewelry and watches
- ♦ Dolls
- ♦ Firearms
- ♦ Any items which are "pre-Columbian pottery" or said to be such
- ♦ If Chinaware, don't bring all pieces. Just one piece, like a plate, is sufficient to appraise a set.
- ♦ If Silverware, just bring one place setting. That's sufficient.
- ♦ Also avoid books with author's signature – too hard to do in time available
- ♦ Likewise photographs with signature of subject in picture – too hard to verify and time consuming

Do bring any information you already have about the item. That can be very helpful.

The event runs from 9:00 to noon on Saturday, August 9th.

The charge per item to be appraised is \$10/object, payable at the registration table upon arrival.



Genealogy Resources At the Stevne

The 2014 stevne in Saint Cloud, Minnesota is two months away and we will have a large section of materials for attendees to use in finding their ancestors. As with the past three stevner, we will not be bringing the microfilms of the church records nor the microfiche of the censuses, but instead relying on the Internet for these resources.

Bygdebøker, Church Records and Censuses

Our main resource for genealogical research are the bygdebøker of which we will have nearly 80. The bygdebøker that we bring are largely from the University of Wisconsin library, which has one of the largest collections in the country, along with books that we are borrowing from the Norwegian-American Genealogical Center & Naeseth Library in Madison. The list of the books that we will bring to the stevne is located at <http://www.nhohlag.org> on the lag web page. We invite suggestions for other bygdebøker to bring, and members who have bygdebøker are also encouraged to bring their books to share.

We have developed electronically searchable indexes for 13 of the parishes and will be working to expand that in time for the stevne.

As noted above, we will no longer bring microfilms of the original church records, nor the microfiche of the censuses. These records are available through the Internet. We will have several computers for people to use, but if you have a laptop, be sure to bring it if you would like to access these records on your own computer.

Rygh List

In the late 1800's and early 1900's, Oluf Rygh put together a comprehensive list of Norwegian farm names by fylke, kommune and parish, along with the history of their names. This is a very valuable resource for finding ancestral farms, and we will have this list for Hedmark fylke in both a paper copy and a computerized form.

Topographical Maps

We will have a complete section of topographical maps of the NHOH area, many with indexes to the farms, to help members see where their farms are located.

Farm Operator Books

In the 1940's and 1960's, two series of books (*Norske:Gardsbruk*) were put together that provide

information on most of the farms in Norway, giving the then-current owner along with the some genealogical information and a description of the farm along with a photo of the farm house. In many cases, the family has been on the same farm for generations, providing a useful genealogical link. We will have both sets of books.

Cousin-finding Database

Just over 200 people have submitted their genealogical charts of their ancestors from the Hedmark area, which have been compiled into a database for searching for common ancestors. This database has over 8,300 entries – a jump of over 800 since last year! We will have both the paper copies, sorted by kommune, as well as a computerized version.

If you bring your own ancestry records and we will look for a match and enter them into the database and three ring binder for future matches. Or better, send in your chart before the stevne, and I will look for any cousins, including those that you can meet at the stevne!

Ringsaker resources

More of our members have roots in Ringsaker than in any other kommune in Hedmark fylke, but, unfortunately, there are no traditional bygdebøker for this area. Thus, the lag is collecting and developing other resources for this area.

One such resource is the series of Ringsakboka, of which the lag has five volumes. These give a history of Ringsaker from the earliest of history to the mid-1900's. Closely associated are the Ringsaker historielag yearbooks from 1979 through 2012, and we will bring a translation of the table of contents of these books. In addition, this translation is on the NHOH web page and we will translate any of the articles into English for members.

We also have a database of over 28,000 names of people from Ringsaker as found in history books and magazines, which will be available on computer. This database has proven to be extremely valuable to finding information -- including pictures -- of Ringsaker relatives. This database includes all those in the 1865 Norwegian census who were either born in Ringsaker or lived in Ringsaker at that time. Also added are the listing of all immigrants up to 1900 from Norwegian ports who reported themselves as being from Ringsaker.

Family History Books

This is a growing part of our collection, and we have about two dozen family histories to share. We invite all members to bring a copy of their own family history to show and, if they would like, one to donate to the lag.

Members of Predecessor Lags

We have membership lists of two lags which were predecessor lags – Østerdalslaget and Mjøsenlaget – and we can search to see if your ancestors were members of these lags. Rollie Krogstad, who led the formation of our lag, had a grandfather who he knew quite well who was a member of Mjøsenlaget. Maybe you do too!

Bring Your Laptop!

The Digital Archives of the Norwegian census and church records continues to expand and I strongly recommend that people with laptops bring their computers. In many cases, the copies of the church records on the Internet are easier to read than those on film and you will have the ability to

copy them to your computer and alter the shading, contrast and sharpness, as well as insert them into documents, such as family histories.

Additionally, we can share other electronic records from my laptop to yours via a USB stick.
