My Visit to a Norwegian-style Stave Church in the Harz Mountains of Northern Germany

A highlight of my recent two-week tour to Europe was a visit to the Harz Mountains region of Northern Germany, which was the ancestral homeland of my "Norsk-Tysk" (Norwegian-German) great-great grandfather, Johann Heinrich Conrad Daniel DOMEYER (AKA Henry DOMIER). Henry was born in the village of Lerbach, near Osterode am Harz, in 1832, and emigrated to Norway in the late 1850s with his half-brother to work as charcoal burners for Baron Herman Wedel-Jarlsberg's Bærums Verk north of Oslo.

While planning our itinerary for the Harz Mountains portion of our trip, we learned that there was a Norwegianstyle wooden stave church located in the small village of Hahnenklee - a climatic health resort with 1100 inhabitants, located a 30 minute drive from my ancestor's home village of Lerbach.

The **Gustav Adolf Stave Church** (*Gustav Adolf Stabkirche*) in Hahnenklee was designed by Professor Karl Mohrmann (1857-1927), who was a Professor of Medieval Architecture at the Technical University of Hanover, and part-time church architect for the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Hanover, Germany. It was built to replace a much smaller prayer room, which by 1900 was not large enough to accommodate the numerous visitors to this popular tourist destination as a "spa town". Professor Mohrmann advocated for a wooden church, as this construction method was a good fit with the Upper Harz landscape. He based his design on the architectural style of Norwegian stave churches, including the Borgund Stave Church, which he had visited on a study trip to Norway. The church was constructed over a period of 10 months in 1907-1908 using local Harz wood and was consecrated on June 28, 1908. It is much larger and brighter than the original stave churches of Norway and has many familiar elements including ship symbols and carved dragon heads. It has a Goll organ (installed in 1994) and a bell tower (added in 1975) featuring a large carillon (*turmglockenspiel*) with 49 bells. Organ and carillon concerts are held regularly between May and October. It is also a popular choice as a wedding venue.

In Memoriam

John Edward Kittleson



John Edwards Kittelson, son of Helmey and Ella (Grunning) Kittelson, was born in rural Norway Township in Lincoln County, SD, on July 19, 1936. When John was 5 years old his father died and the family moved to

Sioux Falls, where he grew up and graduated from Washington High in 1954. He then attended Augustana College for one year before entering the United States Air Force. While in the service he trained to become a Jet Fighter Pilot. After his military duty he returned to South Dakota and attended the University of South Dakota and later graduated from Augustana College. He also graduated from the University of Northwest Missouri State and the US Air Force Command and Staff College.

On June 28, 1959 he was united in marriage to Marcia Gunderson in Aberdeen, SD. The couple then moved to Santa Monica, CA, where John worked for System Development Corporation. While there, John flew with the Oxnard, CA, Air National Guard. In 1964 the couple returned to Sioux Falls where he began working with Raven Industries as a project manager and continued his military service with the SD Air National Guard. In 1972 John began his career with New York life and was presently still working.

John was a long-time member of First Lutheran Church. He was very active in the local, state and national insurance industry serving on legislative committees and working as a lobbyist. He was active for 36 years in the Air Force, Air National

Guard and Air Force Reserve, retiring as a Full Bird Colonel. His community involvement was extensive. He served as a local president and district Lieutenant Governor for Optimist International. John was active in Rotary, Veterans Affairs Committee, Military Officers Association of America, the Sioux Falls Chamber of Commerce, boards of SD Children's Home Society, SD Investment Society, Sioux Falls Boys Club and Sioux Falls Airport Authority. He was also a proud member of the El Riad Shrine and a 32nd degree Scottish Rite Mason.

Grateful for having shared his life are his wife, Marcia Kittelson, Sioux Falls, SD; his children, John Kittelson, Houston, TX, Susan (Jeff Miller) Doty, Sioux Falls, SD; four grandchildren (Katherine, Jillian, Nicholas and Elizabeth), 1 great grandchild; his brothers, Desmond (Linda) Kittelson, San Antonio, TX, and Karol (Joan) Kittelson, Yankton, SD; and a host of other relatives and friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents and a sister, Beverly Claussen.



Nordmanden Serendipity

Genealogists sometimes find something good without looking for it. Call it unexpected good luck. Such is the case with the giant from Østerdalen.

Recently, my distant cousin in Norway, Morten Undseth, stumbled over a notice in an old newspaper that had an article on Østerdalslaget. It was published in approximately 1936-7 and tells about a "giant," the strongest man in the district. The giant from Østerdalen. He is described like this in the magazine/paper "Nordmanden" (the Norseman) in no. 32. In Kathryn I met this strong man from Østerdalen, by the name of P. N. Undseth.

who has become strong due to drinking sour milk. He drinks several gallons of sour milk a day, his favorite drink. You have to search a long time for a stronger man. Mr. Undseth owns and runs a hotel in Kathryn, as well as operating the telephone central in the same building. At the same time he is a farmer, a very thrifty man. He is a reliable Sons of Norway member and was the president for many years in the city. In the picture of Østerdalslaget in Fergus Falls in 1935, this giant appears in a gray suit as the biggest/ tallest in the lag.


Since P. N. Undseth was described in the article, Morten reached out to me to find a copy of the 1935 Østerdalslaget photograph taken in Fergus Falls. Minnesota, to see if he could identify P. N. Undseth.

I forwarded Morten a copy of the photograph along with information I found about P. N. Undseth. From North Dakota census records. I was able to determine that his name was Peder N. Undseth and that at the time of the photograph he would have been 57 years old. He was born in Norway and lived in Kathryn, North Dakota.

With the description from the article and the fact that we knew he was 57 years old, Morten was able to identify him in the photograph. Morten found

that his name was Peder Nilsen Undseth and that he was born in Øvre Rendalen on the farm Millehaugen in 1877. Millehaugen is a farm in the community/cluster of farms that are situated in Unset (Undseth).

Morten also posted the 1935 Østerdalslag photograph on several Rendalen Facebook pages to see if anyone was able to identify anyone else. In response someone was able to find her grand uncle Anders (Andrew) Urseth in the photo. Anders was born in Tolga in 1876.

The Hjemkomst Replica Viking Ship -

A descendant of Norwegian immigrants and their older Viking counterparts, Robert Asp, decided that he would return to the sea. Robert dreamed of building a Viking ship with his brother. A ship modeled after the Gokstad burial ship and he would sail it to Norway.

In July, 1980, the ship was completed and removed from the old potato warehouse, in Hawley, Minnesota where it had been built. In August, 1980 the ship was escorted to Duluth and launched in Duluth Harbor. Robert assured the port authority that the Hjemkomst would float but couldn't guarantee that it would float right side up. On August 8, 1980, the Hjemkomst took her maiden voyage under her own power.

In 1982, after the crew received the required training and raised the needed capital, the ship set sail for Norway.

Hopperstad Stave Church Replica

Built between 1996 and 2001, the Moorhead Stave Church (or Hopperstad Stave Church Replica) in Moorhead, Minnesota, stands as a testament to Norwegian culture and heritage in the Midwest.

As of 2017, twenty-eight stave churches remain in Norway. One of these is the Hopperstad Stave Church, which for nearly 900 years has stood on the outskirts of Vik. It was this church that Guy

Paulson chose to replicate in the 1990s.

centuries. The name comes from the support pillars (staves) in their interiors. Between 900 and 1000

Scandinavian stave churches were built during the twelfth and thirteenth

At seventy-two feet in height, the church is a full-scale replica of the original. There are eighteen staves, each standing twenty-seven feet tall. The main structure is made of pine from Minnesota, with the portal carving done in redwood; 24,000

Michigan cedar shingles adorn its roof. While modern construction methods and tools were used, Paulson did all the carvings by hand.

How to make spit for a DNA test

Have you or someone you know had difficulty producing enough spit for a DNA test? If you have, this process I found will help. I used this on a family member who was having difficulty providing enough spit for the test and it worked like a charm. We followed this process for an AncestryDNA test. It didn't take any longer for Ancestry to process the test than normal and it correctly identified their relationship to family members who had already taken the test. The step by step instructions I found are reprinted below and at the bottom of the page is the link to both the instructions and a video that will show you how it's done.

Supplies:

- Distilled water
- 3 clean disposable cups
- 1 measuring syringe
- Simply Saline Adult Nasal Mist (DO NOT get saline with other additives or medications)
- GUM Go-Betweens ProxaBrush Cleaners (Wide works best)
- Your DNA spit kit of choice (I used Ancestry DNA but 23andme works too!)



1: Create Your Artificial Saliva Solution

- 1. Pour a fair amount of distilled water into one of the clean cups.
- 2. Spray a small amount of saline into another clean cup until it pools in the bottom.
- 3. Measure 99ml of distilled water into the third clean cup.
- 4. Measure 1ml of saline into the third clean cup.
- 5. Discard the two unmixed cups.

2: Take Your Sample

Now the fun part! You will need to obtain your sample.

- 1. Measure approximately 5ml of your artificial saliva and fill the test tube 2-3mm ABOVE the fill line. As you remove swabs, liquid will be removed from the container, so overfilling it very slightly will not be a problem.
- 2. Swab the GUM brushes on the cheeks 10-20 seconds, then place tip down into the DNA tube to soak for another 10-20 seconds. You may "stir" them in the tube as well. Remove the swab carefully allowing the liquid to drip off of it and into the vial, and scraping the swab along the edge to ensure as much is left behind as possible.
- 3. Repeat above until all 8 swabs have been used. While swabbing, it is best to leave the previous swab in the solution to soak.


Note: If the mouth is especially dry, dip the swab tip in your excess solution before swabbing.

3: Proceed as normal

At this point, your saliva sample should look identical to actual saliva. It's actually pretty cool. If you tilt and swish it near a light source, you should be able to see debris from the cheeks and it should be thick and slimy just like actual spit. Screw on the cap with the stabilizing liquid, place it in the pouch, seal the box and ship it in!
